REFLECTIONS FROM THE RABBI

----The High Holy Day season is sometimes called the Days of Awe, from the Hebrew Yamim Nora'im, in part to remind us to stop and be in awe of our lives and the world around us. But the Hebrew word *nora* does not exactly convey the meaning of awe that we are used to, the one that is synonymous with wonder or amazement. Instead, it invokes a sense of fear and trembling, especially as related to our relationship with God. During the Days of Awe we are called on to look unflinchingly at our lives, to recognize the blessings around us and to come to terms with our shortcomings and even areas in which we need to seek forgiveness. This kind of selfexamination can be pretty terrifying. That's why we come together as a community at this time and recite prayers of both thanksgiving and atonement together. It's not because we share the same experiences, or even the experiences of the prayers for the holy days. We read the litany of sins not because each of us has committed each one, but to provide support for the one among us who seek atonement but be afraid. This give us the courage to face the fear and trembling together.

This year I would like to offer an exercise to help each of us express both gratitude and regret with more support and openness. Starting at the Selichot service, and going through the end of Yom Kippur, three areas will be set up in the social hall near the bulletin board. One will be the opportunity to express gratitude, one will be our hopes for the year ahead, and one will be to express a desire for forgiveness. All will be anonymous but, for those who want to, there will be the opportunity to post them on the bulletin board.

Alternatively, your notes can go into a sealed box that will be destroyed at the break-fast.

Inside this bulletin are forms that you can use to help organize your thoughts. Please bring them during the Days of Awe as a way to deepen your holy day observance.

This month's recipe from the kitchen of Roger Hoffman

Cranberry Chicken

Ingredients:

1 whole chicken in pieces or 1 package of chicken thighs & legs 2 sweet potatoes, sliced into thin rounds 2 1/2 cups canned cranberry sauce garlic powder ginger powder kosher salt fresh black pepper dried parsley flakes

Directions:

Pre heat oven to 400F


Lay out your chicken pieces and pat them dry with a paper towel.

Generously sprinkle on both sides of the chicken pieces, the garlic, ginger, salt, pepper, and parsley flakes.


Lay half of your sweet potatoes slices on the bottom of your baking pan. Then lay your chicken pieces on top. Spread out the rest of your sweet potato slices on top of the chicken.

Loosen your cranberry sauce up in a bowl (add a little hot water if you need to). Pour the sauce evenly over all the chicken and potatoes. Throw another pinch of all the spices over the sauce and put the chicken in the oven to bake.

Bake for about 1 1/2 hours.



RECIPE OF THE MONTH



ROASTED EGGPLANT WITH TECHINA & CHILI SAUCE

Eggplant is now "in" in our house. We had kind of forgotten about it. Then a few weeks ago we had eggplant salad at a friend's house and rediscovered this economical, versatile and tasty vegetable. Our favorite way to eat it is roasted with techina and sweet chili sauce.

Prep Time: 5 minutes **Cook Time:** 30 minutes **Total Time:** 35 minutes

Ingredients:

2 whole eggplants 1/2 lemon 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil Salt

Preparation:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F

Cut eggplant in half and rub with juice from lemon

Then cut eggplant halves into medium thick wedges. Put some olive oil into the palm of your hand and rub on slices until just lightly coated Sprinkle with salt

Roast the eggplant at 375 degrees F for 20-30 minutes or until browned on top and cooked through

Serving Suggestion: Serve the eggplant slices warm. Put two small bowls on the table, one with techina and the other with sweet chili sauce. Each person can top their eggplant with the sauce or sauces they like.
